

2022 Community Needs Assessment Response Summary

A community needs assessment was conducted in Fall 2022 by surveying community members and partners in West CAP's 7 county service area. Focus groups were also held to get a deeper understanding of survey results. In total, there were 156 community member participants and 27 community partner participants.
